At the annual meeting last year, a couple of members brought in some weeds that they had found on the shoreline in front of their camps. They asked the Board to look into this. In the fall a representative of the Agency of Natural Resources took a boat ride around the lake with a number of board members and lake residents to do some shoreline and lakebed review. At that time, we did learn that there is a process in place to deal with nuisance weeds on shore lines in front of individual camps. We had plans for that State representative to speak at our annual meeting, however that person is no longer with the State of Vermont and we are working on having his replacement speak. If not, the Board will provide the information about the process.

As proposed and discussed at the 2018 Annual Meeting, and for ease of planning, the Board decided that the Annual Meeting will be held on the third Saturday in June each year. Glover Ambulance provides emergency services, wellness checks, transfers, and training to the area (Albany, Westmore and Glover) with a team of six Advanced EMT's, six EMT's, and three EMR's. The squad has two fully equipped ambulances, one ATV, one UTV, and a snow mobile with sled to meet the challenges of our areas emergency needs. Fishing & Wildlife Report

- The State of Vermont stocked Lake Parker with 400 rainbow trout on May 6th of this year. Starting in 2020, Parker is in the State system for 900 rainbow trout per year. Many thanks to Jud Kratzer, our local State Fish and Wildlife Biologist. Please email John Wooten (umbday@comcast.net), Chair of the Fishing & Wildlife Committee, with any questions or observations. John will inform the State of our observations at the end of the summer.
- The State released its fish survey which was conducted May 24, 2018 utilizing their special equipment at night. The results are similar to those found in the previous survey conducted in 2009. In 2018, the State added bullheads and pumpkinseeds to its survey; they were not counted in the 2009 survey. No trout were recorded in 2009; some trout were recorded in 2018 and are thought by the State to be those stocked earlier in 2018, not trout stocked in previous years. Contact John Wooten for a copy or additional information.
- Due to budget constraints, the State may be closing the Salisbury Fish Culture Station which would limit the availability of fish for stocking purposes. The State estimates that closing this facility would save \$250k for the fiscal year of 2020 and would avoid the \$12 million estimated cost required by the State's Clean Water Act to upgrade water treatment of the discharge generated by the culture process.
- At our October 2018 board meeting a request was made to gather some information on cormorants (birds); the State indicates that since they are a protected migratory bird, without a special permit, apparently issued by the federal government, there is not much we can do to rid the lake of these birds. The contest is now open for this year. All entries must be submitted by September 30th, 2019. Photos taken anytime before September 30th, 2019 can be entered.

By entering the photo, the member grants the LPA permission to use the photo on the LPA website and/or in LPA Calendars or Newsletters at no cost to the LPA.
