2022 ANNUAL MEETING

Again, this year, we have seen an increase of activity on the Lake. I and others have noticed that there are a number of activities going on at one time with all being very respectful of each other's activity.

We have had very limited number of reports, mainly people not having life jackets on standup boards. Also, we have seen boats pulling skiers and tubes without any spotter in the boat. On the website and in the packets handed to each camp it states the State of Vermont Rules and Regulations on this.

We have not had any issues reported of boats chasing loons, unleashed dogs chasing animals on the shoreline and in the water or any other acts of harassment to wildlife this year.

I am working on a program to proactively promote the use of the proper use of life vests especially on stand up boards. You may see this in the current year or next year.

There is another no wake buoy deployed on the East side. The buoys on the lake are there to show people how far 200 feet really is from the shoreline which is the State of Vermont Rule and Regulations for wakes.

Enjoy summer on the Lake, and remember to please follow State of Vermont rules and regulations for everyone's safety.
