

LAKE PARKER BOAT AND WATER SAFETY COMMITTEE REPORT
2025 ANNUAL MEETING

In the month of June, I observed multiple paddleboarders without any life jackets. A group of young people came from the north end of the lake paddleboarding with no life vests, and I could not find out where they came from. I will continue to have one on one conversations and we as an association will continue our education efforts.

A point of observation is that before boats reach their plane, they create very large waves. The buoys on the lake are there to show people how far 200 feet really is from the shoreline, which is the State of Vermont Rule and Regulations for wakes.

Through the end of last year and beginning of this year we have not received any complaints of dangerous or unthoughtful operation of boats. However, I was told that we had a snowmachine on Lake Parker approximately July 4th on the west side of the lake.

As a camp owner, and possible renter of your camp, we ask that you post the information that is provided in your resource guide so anyone from your location understands the rules for what is required when participating in water sports on the lake. For example- There must be a life jacket on a stand-up board.

Enjoy summer on the Lake, and remember to please follow State of Vermont Boat Safety Rules & Regulations.
